BOOKING CONDITIONS

Concessions – children under 17 are half price if accompanied by adults. Senior Citizens, i.e. those entitled to state retirement pension, are entitled to a reduction for Season Tickets only. Students under 25 in full-time education are admitted at a concession rate (proof of student status required).

Refunds – we regret that we must make an administration charge of 25% for refunding tickets for the Festival and New Year's Eve. **NO REFUNDS** can be made within seven days of the event.

Discounts for advance bookings for the Festival and New Year's Eve apply only to tickets ordered AND PAID FOR in advance.

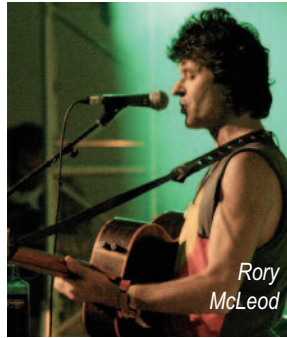

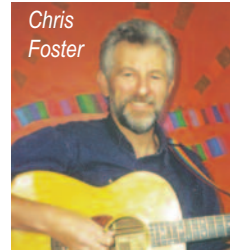
Haddenham Concerts

The usual format (except on 3rd December, our Festival – see separate page) is for our MC, **Kitty Vernon**, to start the evening at 8.45pm and our guests to do a couple of 45-minute spots from 9pm. The room only seats 50, so make sure you're there in plenty of time to enjoy the entertainment.

troubadour using tap shoes, a cappella, guitar, trombone, spoons and various percussion instruments, whilst **Chris Foster** (5th November) is an English singer and guitarist respected for his interpretations of traditional and contemporary songs. And for our Festival

evening we welcome the superlative **Martin Simpson** (3rd December).

Andy Cutting (7th January) is a rarity. A musician's musician: a soulful and technically

outstanding melodeon player who engages his audiences with his self-deprecating wit and then floors them with downright staggering musicianship.

Jackie Oates (4th February) is a singer and fiddle player with a pure, haunting singing style and on this occasion is joined by **Karen Tweed**, the wacky and elegant English accordion queen.

Tom McConville (3rd March) is a virtuoso musician and fantastic singer with a rich and warm voice and is joined by a fine guitarist, **David Newey**.

Dave Swarbrick (7th April) is a brilliant fiddle player and fine singer who is more famously known for his work with Fairport

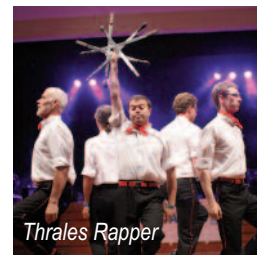

This band is Shropshire and Staffordshire based and had not played at Haddenham for many years until last season and were immediately rebooked. **Hugh Rippon** will again mastermind the evening's entertainment.

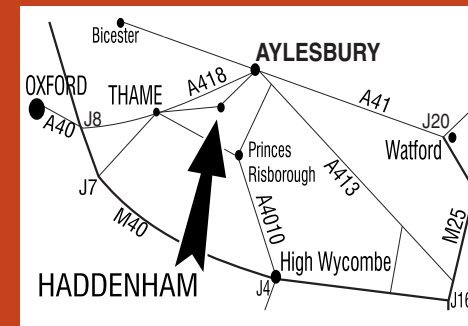

HOW TO GET THERE

Haddenham is 15 miles east of Oxford, only 60 minutes from Central London and 15 minutes from Junctions 7 & 8 of the M40. Arrive by train from London Marylebone or Birmingham Snowhill on the Chiltern Line to Haddenham/Thame Parkway. Arriva 280 bus from Aylesbury to Oxford stops at the Village Hall.
